We are a few weeks into Lent? Are you sticking to your fasting, praying and almsgiving? We fast, we pray and we give so that we can focus on our spiritual lives. It allows us the opportunity to focus on Our Lord and how he suffered for all of us to save our souls.

School Reconciliation is March 9th. Perhaps you can help your child remember some of their

wrongdoings that they so quickly forget. For example, what commandments have they broken? (Honor thy Father and Mother, Keep holy the sabbath, that shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain). Or perhaps they have broken the greatest commandment...that of love?

We have chosen to inform you as the parents first to let you determine the best way to inform your child about Bailey. We do not currently have a replacement for Bailey, but will be working with Pet Partners of Greater Cincinnati to find another therapy dog to work with our students. If your child has any problems or questions, our school psychologist, Mrs. Dallal is a wonderful resource. Please reach out and let me know if you would like your child to speak with her.




