AUG'S BLOG

Visitation Families,

This is a part of the Church Bulletin series called "Word and Worship". It is written by seminarian Jacob Schmiesing. It describes different parts of the Mass. Our Father: In the Gospels, Matthew and Luke have different versions of the Our Father. We pray the longer version from Matthew 6:9-13. The priest's embolism, or short prayer at the end, is taken in part from Titus 2:13 "...As we await the blessed hope and the coming ...of our Savior, Jesus Christ." Finally, the closing doxology is found in some Biblical manuscripts after Matthew 6:13 but was most likely a liturgical addition in the fourth or fifth century.
