Children can choose to have the book read to them and then answer follow up questions regarding the story. CATHOLIC EDUCATION FUND SCHOLARSHIPS

This is to clarify some information about the Catholic Education Fund (CEF) Scholarships given by the Archdiocese. Information about these scholarships was sent out last week.

There are three different CEF scholarships.

- 1. An Elementary Scholarship for Preschool-8th grade students based on financial aid.
- 2. A Welcome Scholarship for new families to a Catholic School (you have never had a child attend a Catholic School prior).
- 3. An Employee Scholarship for employees of the Archdiocese.

To apply for the elementary scholarship, **you need to apply through your FACTS account.** By applying to FACTS, you automatically are applying for the elementary CEF scholarship.

To apply for the Welcome or Employee Scholarships, please go to Catholicbestchoice.org >affordability>click on either the Welcome Scholarship or Employee Scholarship Box.

As a reminder, if you receive a full EdChoice Scholarship for your child, that child would not qualify for any of these scholarships. The Elementary Scholarship is based on the financial needs of your family.


