Visitation Families,

Today's mass tidbit - One important part of the Mass is called the Liturgy of the Word. This includes the readings, responsorial psalm, and the Gospel. The first reading comes from the Old Testament. The responsorial psalm is our "response" to that first reading. That response could be one of joy, distress or praise. The second reading is apostolic, meaning it comes from one of the apostles, from the New Testament. The Gospel then comes from one of

the four Gospel writers (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John). The purpose of the Liturgy of the Word is to prepare our heart, mind and soul to receive the body and blood of Christ. **Reminder**: To log in to receive a weekly mass informational video and intro about The Mass from Archbishop Schnurr go to https://catholicaoc.org/themass.

ACEO Scholarship Information Meeting For the 2023 Reds Season!

Welcome to the new folks who want to find out more about our program. We are having a mandatory meeting for ALL new members to ACEO.

Date: Monday, February 6, 2023

Time: 6:30 PM -- *Please arrive 10-15 minutes prior*

Location: Elder High School – Schaeper Center

(Faces Glenway Ave.)

Everyone is welcome!!!

Here are high level details of what is required. Please look over this and if you would like more details about the program, please have a member of your family attend this meeting.

- You must be at least 16 years of age to work at Reds games.
- You will be required to attend 5-hour training class at Great American Ball Park before you can work.
- You must commit to working at least 10 games for the season.
- You must be able to work in a concession stand (work on a register, pour beer, grill, setup, cleanup, etc).
- You will be at the ballpark for approximately 7-8 hours, and you will be on your feet this entire time without breaks. Report time is about 3 hours prior to game time, and you must stay until after the game (including rain delays and extra innings)
- A credit will go into your account each time you work, and payments will be mailed to your school/organization once a quarter. The funds raised can be used for tuition, school trips, and other school activities.
- A member of each family looking to join our group must attend this meeting. The representative for your family must be over 18 years of age. ALL minors (16-18) must be accompanied by a parent at this meeting.

Catholic School Supporters May Be Eligible for an Ohio Tax Credit!



The State of Ohio has passed a bill that allows a tax credit for qualified donations to a certified Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO). Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, non-refundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750 per donor (up to \$1,500 if married and filing jointly). See section 5747.73 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO). In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, the CEF-SGO will provide scholarships (based on financial need) to students in grades K-12 in the Catholic schools of our Archdiocese.

Your donation can be designated to benefit a specific school(s).Gifts that are not designated to a particular school will be available to families with the greatest need across our Archdiocese.

Consult with your tax advisor to determine: (1) your eligibility for the state tax credit, (2) its value to you, and (3) the details of your gift.

PLEASE NOTE: According to a representative from the Ohio Department of Taxation, if you file a married joint return, each taxpayer would need to make their own \$750 contribution to claim the maximum of \$1,500. Separate acknowledgement letters will be provided for documentation of your gifts.

Sandwich & Snack Collection for Our Daily Bread Sunday, Feb 26TH 6:15 p.m.- 7:00 p.m.



Pavilion

(Note: the Pavilion is located in the lower lot behind church adjacent to sports fields)

Make At Visitation or Make at Home and Drop-Off Event: The sandwiches we make will be provided to ODB guests with every hot meal so that they can have something to eat later in the day or over the weekend. They are also given out to kids after school and to people to bring to work. All items collected will be delivered to ODB the next day.

Here are ways you and your family can help:

1) <u>Bring your supplies to the Visitation Pavilion and assemble the sandwiches with others from our combined parish families.</u> All are welcome!! (Bring-Bread, cheese, meat, zippered sandwich bags.)

2) Make Sandwiches or Treats at Home:

Meat Sandwich Assembly Instructions: Bread and meat; cheese is a bonus, no condiments. <u>Any type of bread or meat is accepted</u>, but ODB guest prefer **white bread.** If position cheese in the middle of two slices of meat, prevents cheese from making the bread soggy.



Peanut Butter & Jelly Sandwich Instructions: Please put a thin layer of peanut butter on each piece of bread and jelly /jam in the middle. (Protects bread longer from getting soggy.)

FAMILY GOAL: make 20-40 sandwiches with 2-3 slices of meat/ sandwich (2-4 loaves of bread, 1-2 pounds meat, ½ pound cheese, do not use the ends/butts of the loaf.)

** **Place each individual sandwich** in a **zippered** sandwich bag and **mark or label** with the type of sandwich or label the box/container. BOXES are preferred to prevent sandwiches from getting squished during transit to ODB.

Make Treats at Home or Donate Packaged Treats:

Instructions for donating treats: If making from scratch, separate into individual treats- place in plastic wrap or zip locked bags. **Treat examples:** HEART shaped iced cookies, chocolate chip cookies, cookie bars, brownies, rice crispy treats, donuts, muffins, cake balls, individual servings of pie or cake.



3) ADDITIONAL ITEMS TO DONATE TO ODB:



- Lunchables, tuna pouches, ravioli with meat, Dinty Moore/Chunky (soup/stew-pop tops only)
- Breakfast/Granola Bars, Individual-size nuts or cracker packs, apple sauce or fruit cups, snack sized bagged chips, Little Debbie snacks...
- Cases of Water or Kids Drinks
- Soft Fruit- Oranges and Bananas (no apples or pears please, many ODB guests struggle with eating these

About the Camp

This summer camp is designed for all students entering grades K through 8, regardless if they attend TREC, and who love to perform and are interested in learning about putting on a Broadway Kids production in one week! Students will learn the songs and dances, as well as create costume pieces in order to perform for parents in a show (or two) at the end of the week. Each child registered will have a part – auditions are for placement purposes only.

The \$200/225 cost for the week includes: a part in the show, a show t-shirt, dinner before the show on Friday, and 2 tickets to each performance on Friday & Saturday. Additional tickets may be purchased at the door for only \$5.

The money is refundable ONLY if camp materials are returned immediately, and if notice is given at least ONE FULL WEEK prior to camp. Refunds will not be given if camp materials aren't returned, if it's too close to camp, or if camp has already started. If you are eligible for a refund, a check will be mailed.

About the shows:

This year, the TRCT Summer Camp will be performing **Seussical Kids** for their first session and **Shrek The Musical Jr.** for the second session.

Seussical Kids transports audiences from the Jungle of Nool to the Circus McGurkus, while the Cat in the Hat, our narrator, tells the story of Horton, an elephant who discovers a speck of dust containing tiny people called the Whos, including Jojo, a Who child, who gets in trouble for thinking too many "thinks." Horton's challenge is twofold - not only must he protect the Whos from a world of naysayers and dangers, but he must also guard an abandoned egg that's been left in his care by the irresponsible Mayzie La Bird. Although Horton faces ridicule, danger, kidnapping and a trial, the intrepid Gertrude McFuzz never loses faith in him. Ultimately, the powers of friendship, loyalty, family and community are challenged and emerge triumphant!

Shrek The Musical Jr. tells the story of an ogre named Shrek. One day, Shrek finds his swamp invaded by banished fairytale misfits who have been cast off by Lord Farquaad, a tiny terror with big ambitions. When Shrek sets off with a wisecracking donkey to confront Farquaad, he's handed a task - if he rescues feisty princess Fiona, his swamp will be righted. Shrek tries to win Fiona's love and vanquish Lord Farquaad, but a fairytale wouldn't be complete without a few twists and turns along the way.

Expectations

The staff members of the TRCT Summer drama camp want your child to have a great experience, but your child must be able to adhere to some expectations. Please make sure your child is willing/able to do the following before attending:

- Practice OUTSIDE of summer camp in learning songs and dance moves BEFORE and DURING the camp period (students will receive script and materials after receiving payment and registration)
- Take constructive criticism from adults and high school staff
- Memorize lines, songs and dances by Friday of that week.
- Attend the summer camp for the ENTIRE duration for all of the days
- Be a team player and accept their role graciously
- Work well with others and not provide any inappropriate behavior
- Stay focused and be willing to try ALL of the activities for the day
- Respect the staff, student staff, students and facilities of TRCT
- Bring a lunch, their script, pencil, highlighter, and a water bottle to practices everyday
- Be willing to help with clean up and set up for the performances
