Visitation Families,

Over the next few weeks, two students (Ross and Cece) have some big medical challenges ahead of them. Several parents have asked what they can do to support these students. Over and over again, the parents of Ross and CeCe ask for prayers. There is no time to be closer with Our Lord than at Mass, receiving the Eucharist. Mass is a direct encounter with God. Receiving

Him brings us grace and hope. The Sharp and Lanter families have great crosses to carry in their life right now. Help them by receiving the Eucharist on Sunday. In addition, we invite our families to attend the 6:30 a.m. mass with your children on Fridays. If you can't make it every Friday, make it the first Friday or biweekly. Our two friends and their families need your prayers. Mass is our time to offer God thanks, praise and our sacrifices. Update: CeCe is in Seattle struggling with side effects of her new treatment. She has been one sick little girl this week. Ross is going to start a new treatment plan that could possibly cause him to be sick as well. So, when attending mass, pray for the students, their families, and their caregivers.

No Deliveries -Why? We do not allow lunches or homework to be delivered to the office. Why is this? The biggest reason is that our school is extremely large and our office is extremely busy. If 10% of the school forgot an item, that could be 77 deliveries! Students need to learn to deal with adversity. It is a part of life. If they forget their homework, let them learn from the consequences. (If it is a group project, we will allow that delivery). If they forget their lunch, we have students who will share or they can charge a boxed lunch. It gives other students an opportunity to share and sacrifice. Your child will survive, and we will get them fed. In allowing our students to deal with small challenges, it prepares them for the larger challenges of the world. With having 772 students, a lot of what we do involves logistics. Please follow the guidelines.

COOK'S CURRICULUM CORNER



The completed Essay along with the envelope containing the Application Form must be returned by the date determined by your building Principal.

A representative from the Knights of Columbus will collect the envelopes of the Finalists on Monday, March 8, 2023.

The winners will be announced the first full week of April.



Sandwich & Snack Collection for Our Daily Bread Sunday, Feb 26TH 6:15 p.m.- 7:00 p.m. Pavilion



(Note: the Pavilion is located in the lower lot behind church adjacent to sports fields)

Make At Visitation or Make at Home and Drop-Off Event: The sandwiches we make will be provided to ODB guests with every hot meal so that they can have something to eat later in the day or over the weekend. They are also given out to kids after school and to people to bring to work. All items collected will be delivered to ODB the next day.

Here are ways you and your family can help:

1) Bring your supplies to the Visitation Pavilion and assemble the sandwiches with others from our combined parish families. All are welcome!! (Bring-Bread, cheese, meat, zippered sandwich bags.)

2) Make Sandwiches or Treats at Home:

Meat Sandwich Assembly Instructions: Bread and meat; cheese is a bonus, no condiments. <u>Any type of bread or meat is accepted</u>, but ODB guest prefer **white bread.** If position cheese in the middle of two slices of meat, prevents cheese from making the bread soggy.



Peanut Butter & Jelly Sandwich Instructions: Please put a thin layer of peanut butter on each piece of bread and jelly /jam in the middle. (Protects bread longer from getting soggy.)

FAMILY GOAL: make 20-40 sandwiches with 2-3 slices of meat/ sandwich (2-4 loaves of bread, 1-2 pounds meat, ½ pound cheese, do not use the ends/butts of the loaf.)

** Place each individual sandwich in a <u>zippered</u> sandwich bag and <u>mark or label</u> with the type of sandwich or label the box/container. BOXES are preferred to prevent sandwiches from getting squished during transit to ODB.

Make Treats at Home or Donate Packaged Treats:

Instructions for donating treats: If making from scratch, separate into individual treats- place in plastic wrap or zip locked bags. **Treat examples:** HEART shaped iced cookies, chocolate chip cookies, cookie bars, brownies, rice crispy treats, donuts, muffins, cake balls, individual servings of pie or cake.



3) ADDITIONAL ITEMS TO DONATE TO ODB:



- Lunchables, tuna pouches, ravioli with meat, Dinty Moore/Chunky (soup/stew-pop tops only)
- Breakfast/Granola Bars, Individual-size nuts or cracker packs, apple sauce or fruit cups, snack sized bagged chips, Little Debbie snacks...
- Cases of Water or Kids Drinks
- Soft Fruit- Oranges and Bananas (no apples or pears please, many ODB guests struggle with eating these
