Today is Ash Wednesday, the official start of Lent. During this time, we ask our students to focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Students are challenged to not only give something up but also to do something extra. How can they enhance their prayer life? Do they need to learn a new bedtime prayer, say the rosary or attend mass during the week? Lenten fasting and sacrifices

are tiny sacramental signs of the true gift we give God: ourselves, body and soul. Today and Good Friday are the two days of Lent where we practice fasting.

Roman Catholics must fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Wednesday, February 22, 2023 and Good Friday, April 7, 2023. Additionally, they must abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but they are not to equal that of a full meal.

Students in K-8 will attend Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent. Students in grades 3-5 will attend Reconciliation this Thursday.

Iowa Testing for Grades 2-7 will begin next week and continue for at least 2 weeks. Please make sure students eat a nutritious breakfast and arrive at school on time.

Congrats to our two junior high academic teams who competed at Elder last week against other area Catholic schools. The students, led by Mrs. Kelhoffer, studied various trivia topics and questions. It involves buzzers in multiple rounds of questions. Congrats to our 7th grade team who came in first place and our 8th grade team who came in second place!

Does your child have a cell phone? Do you check it sporadically? You just might be surprised at some of the inappropriate language students use when it is not monitored. As they say...if you give kids an inch, they will take a mile. Don't forget that speaker Stephen Smith is coming on March 27th to address both students and parents.

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COOK'S CURRICULUM CORNER

Students in grades 2-7 will begin taking Cogats/IOWA tests Monday, February 27th. Students will take these tests for the next two weeks during their morning periods. These tests are required by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and are nationally normed. In order to help your child do well on these tests we ask that you encourage your child to do their best, get plenty of rest and eat a good breakfast. Check out the slides below for some test taking strategies you can share with your child.

Test Taking Strategies

Testing can cause stress and anxiety for students. While at home, have your child try an app to stay calm. A popular app that students use is called Calm. This app provides breathing exercises, relaxing sounds, soothing stories and backdrop music/pictures.

GENERAL REMINDERS


• If your child will be absent from school or tardy, a phone call is required by 8:30 a.m. The direct phone numbers to report a student absent or tardy are:
