We are one week into Lent. How are your Lenten promises going? If you fail, restart! Acknowledge your failure, ask God for forgiveness, forgive yourself and then begin anew. If you fall down on the ground, you pick yourself up. Pick yourself up for the glory of God this Lent.

I made a mistake in last week's newsletter. School Reconciliation is March 9th for grades 3-8.

Please pray for the men in our parish attending the Christ Renews His Parish (CRHP) retreat this weekend. This provides participants a time to reconnect with God and hopefully provide nourishment on their faith journey. If you haven't participated in this weekend, I highly recommend it for anyone who needs some spiritual renewal.

This Friday marks the end of the second trimester. Spring is just around the corner, along which comes Spring Fever. Remind students we still have a long time to go! Make goals for your child. Just as we may fall down during Lent, your child may fall short of their academic/emotional/behavioral/social goals. Encourage them, pick them up when they fall and start anew!

Students in grades 2-7 are taking part in our annual standardized testing. There are two parts taken: the Cogats and the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills. The Cogats is what I like to describe as evaluating what God gave you, it's your natural ability (2nd graders only take the Cogats). The Iowas are how you apply God's gifts. This will take place in the mornings the rest of this week and most of next. Please make sure your child arrives at school on time and eats a healthy breakfast.

Please continue to pray for our friends Ross and CeCe. The last week has had some challenges for both of them. Pray for strength for their parents, patience and knowledge for their caregivers, and courage for both of them! Perhaps your Lenten prayers could include each of them daily. Don't forget that many families are gathering on Friday mornings at 6:30 a.m. mass to pray for these two.

The essay can be no more than one page typewritten or two pages handwritten.

Both pages of the "Application Form" must be completed. The Application Form must be signed by both the student and his/her parents. The Form is to be placed inside a plain white envelope and stapled to the essay.

There can be NO identifying information on either the envelope or in the essay.

The completed Essay along with the envelope containing the Application Form must be returned by the date determined by your building Principal.

A representative from the Knights of Columbus will collect the envelopes of the Finalists on Monday, March 8, 2023.

The winners will be announced the first full week of April.




