Visitation Families,

On Tuesday, September 5th, we celebrated the feast day of St. Teresa of Calcutta. She is quoted as saying... "Not all of us can do great things, but we can all do small things with great love." What a wonderful concept to teach all of our children. So many times, our little ones think they need to complete a grand gesture, when in fact, we just need them to be kind and take care of each other. A little love can go a long way.

Tomorrow we will continue our MAP testing in the area of math. This test is not timed so students are given the opportunity to truly do their best without the pressure of time. As a reminder, we are using MAP testing this year in place of the Iowa testing we have done for the last several years. MAP testing takes place three times a year and is an opportunity for students to show growth.

It is always a good idea to make sure your child knows what to do if no one is home when they get there after school. Does your child know where to go or who to contact if no one is home? Should they go to their neighbors? Do they know the garage code? Do they know your phone number? Do they know how to dial a number on the phone? Some students keep an index card of phone numbers in their backpack in case there is ever an issue. Please be sure to remind your child when transportation changes are made. You should also email the homeroom teacher as another reminder.

Our school raised \$1800 for Caps for the Cure last Friday! A special shout out to Delaney L., Mila K. and Kennedy S. who went around their neighborhoods and collected money for this great cause! COOK'S CURRICULUM CORNER

We have completed AimswebPlus assessments for grades K-1 and are working on completing MAP tests for grades 2-8 this week. We will take these assessments again in the winter and spring to help us look at student growth and make instructional decisions to improve student learning. The MAP tests can take up to two hours for both the reading and math sections. When a child misses a testing day, they will have to make up these assessments when they return, which means they may be missing another half day of instruction and will be required to make up missed class work for that day. In the future, please try to refrain from scheduling vacations and appointments for your children during testing week. We will be taking these assessments again January 8th-January 12th and May 6th-May 9th.

Results for both the AimswebPlus assessment and MAP Growth Tests will be sent to parents within a few weeks.



I hope you have settled into a daily school routine and your family is ready for another great year! I am already beginning to see some sick kids in school, so this is just a quick reminder of our school policy regarding illness. If we all follow these guidelines, it should make for a great school year!

Guidelines for Childhood Illness and School Attendance:

- Temperature: If your child has a fever (a temperature of 100.0 F. or greater) they should remain at home until they have been fever free for a full 24 hours without giving any fever, reducing medication and they have returned to their typical behavior. It is important for you to take your child's temperature before giving the fever-reducing medicine.
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea: Your child should remain at home until they have been
 without any episodes of vomiting or diarrhea for a full 24 hours and have resumed a
 typical diet. If your child has had any of these symptoms during the night she/he
 should not be sent to school the following day.
- Taking antibiotics at home: According to the Ohio Department of Health, your child should remain at home for at least <u>24 hours</u> after starting antibiotics. This includes (but not limited to) taking antibiotics for strep throat, pink eye, respiratory infections or any other type of infection that requires antibiotics.
- Cold symptoms: Runny noses are a fact of life with little ones. However if the
 drainage is thick and green or if your child has a persistent or productive cough please
 have your child stay home and consider consulting with your child's doctor. A constant
 dry cough can be a sign of more serious respiratory problems and the doctor should be
 notified.
- Redness or discharge in the eyes: Redness of the white part of the eye, burning or itching, yellow or white matter or crusted eyelashes are the signs of pink eye or conjunctivitis. This is very contagious. Your child should remain at home until she/he has seen the doctor and has been on medication/antibiotics for 24 hours.
- Chicken pox: Chicken pox is a skin rash consisting of small blisters, which leave scabs. There may or may not be a fever present. Children need to remain at home until all blisters have scabbed over, usually 5-7 days after the first appearance of blisters.
- Rashes: Rashes can be difficult to evaluate. Skin rashes of unknown origin should be evaluated by a physician before your child is sent to school.
- Sore throat: If your child has a persistent or severe sore throat they should remain at home. You should consider contacting your child's doctor if there is fever, white patches on the tonsils, swollen tender glands, headache, or stomach ache. These could indicate a possible strep infection. If that is the case, your child should remain at home until he/she has had 24 hours of antibiotics, is fever free for 24 hours and has resumed typical activity.
- Please remember that these are just guidelines. If in doubt, keep your child home until
 he/she can be checked out further or he/she is better. This is also for the benefit of the
 other children and teachers in the classroom, and will help to keep everyone healthy.

Welcome to a new school year at Visitation!

Vision and hearing screenings are done annually on all students in 1st, $3^{\rm rd}$, $5^{\rm th}$ and 7th grades as well as kindergarten, preschool and any students new to the school. The screenings are done between the beginning of school and December of the school year.

- **IF** there is a problem with your child's hearing or vision you **WILL** receive a letter from the school nurse advising you to see a specialist or pediatrician for follow up.
- **IF** the screening was normal, you will **NOT** receive any notice from the school nurse.
