AUG'S BLOG

Visitation Families,

Hope everyone is doing well this week and getting into their routines. New procedures cause everyone some stress because it is a shock to the brain's previously learned routines. Change causes you to think more. If you get some cranky children at home these first few weeks, it's because their brain has been busy thinking, not only about academics but also about their routines. This is the same reason college freshman who dorm get so stressed. They have to think about where to eat, when to eat, where their

classes are, what their schedule is, etc. This is all extra thinking your brain is just not quite ready to handle all at once. Again, it takes a good 6 weeks to adjust! Your child might be cranky because the brain is on overdrive.

Speaking of procedures...please share carpool information with anyone who may be picking up your children. Also, make sure you let your "sub drivers" know if the children are in Carpool #1 or Carpool #2 and which location.

Carpool front lot in the a.m.- please pull around in the loop as far forward as possible toward the library (building that juts out). This allows for other cars to get in off of South Rd and keeps traffic flowing. Make sure your child is "prepared for departure". Please pull toward the center of the lot if you have a crier, something in the trunk or something big or bulky that does not allow for an easy departure. If the adult needs to get out of the car, you need to pull into the center of the lot so as not to disrupt the flow.

Preschool Dropoff in the a.m. - this is only for preschool and kindergarten students. NO STUDENTS should be dropped off behind school. You need to make two drop offs if you have children in both buildings or you can send your kdg student in through the main parking lot and we will walk them over with the kdg bus riders. All preschoolers, however, must be dropped off in the preschool carpool.

Carpool p.m. - There are only 2 designated areas for pick up. This is in the preschool/kindergarten lot or in the front lot of school. Students are NOT allowed to be picked up in a back corner, side lot, front lot of church, etc. If you need to get to an appointment, you need to sign your child out early. If you are worried about the driver getting into heavy traffic, send them at 3:15 and have them hit the end of the carpool. Preschool pickup location is for those with preschool kids and kindergarten students **ONLY**.

We dismiss 772 students every day and there are guidelines for the entire purpose of keeping children safe. **Please be respectful and follow the carpool rules.**

COOK'S CURRICULUM CORNER

This week, we will complete Aimsweb assessments for students in grades K-5. Aimsweb Plus is universal screening program. The purpose is to monitor student growth in literacy and use the data to guide instruction. Students (grades K-5) are assessed three times during each school year to monitor student growth and progress in reading skills. Results will be sent home late next week via email. If you have any concerns about your child's screening results, be sure to reach out to your child's homeroom teacher.

Parents are always asking for ways to help their child study for assessments. Quizlet (www.quizlet.com) is a free online tool and app that allows your child to make flashcards and create games by simply inputting the material they are studying. Once the material is inputted, Quizlet does the rest and creates multiple games and flashcards. I know many students that would rather use interactive tools to study than the typical paper and pencil.





FAITH:
