VACATION POLICY


Vacation Policy as it appears in the handbook:

- Unexcused absences can be detrimental to a child's educational progress and should be avoided. Parents assume all academic responsibility for such absences. It is not the job of the teacher to cater to social absences.
- If parents decide to remove a student for an "unexcused absence," they are advised that teachers are under no obligation to give students work ahead of time. Any assignments missed, including tests, will be given to the student upon return at a time convenient for the teacher.
- Upon returning to school the student MUST, on the first day back, have any assigned work (if given) completed and handed in to all teachers and be ready to take assessments.
- If the student is missing assignments, regular consequences will be provided.
- If the student experiences problems in class with material that was covered during the student's absence, it will be the parent's responsibility to make arrangements to provide the student with needed instructions.



FAITH:

Girls are encouraged to grow in their faith and relationship with God through the AHG Faith Award Program, prayer, fellowship, and service, which are woven throughout each aspect of the AHG Program.

LEADERSHIP:

The AHG Program is rich in leadership opportunities for girls of all ages. Girls discover their passions, acquire project management skills, hold leadership positions, and participate in leadership training.

Outcome: A servant leader who follows Jesus' model of leadership by putting others first.

SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL

Girls will gain a better understanding of their identity in Christ through the AHG Program. AHG's multi-level Troop structure encourages girls to create friendships with girls of all ages.
