Visitation Families.

Our Church Bulletin has a section called Word and Worship. It is authored by our former seminarian Jacob Schmeising. It will explain different parts of our Catholic Faith. The Catholic Mass is the central act of worship in the Catholic Church where believers gather to celebrate the Eucharist, which IS the true Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. There are two main parts of the mass: the Liturgy of the Word (readings, Scripture, homilies) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, where the bread and wine are consecrated and offered to God. We offer this sacrifice in atonement for our sins. Through Mass, Catholics seek an intimate union with God, spiritual nourishment, renewal and closeness with one another.

The Sign of the Cross Week 1: The sign of the cross, which opens the mass and is prayed at various other times comes from Matthew 28:19. In this verse, the Resurrected Jesus Christ instructs his disciples to go forth baptizing "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." While we may be most familiar with that passage as it concerns the Sacrament of Baptism, it is also the source of the sign of the cross.

We had a wonderful turn out for our parish picnic at Stricker's Grove! Thanks to our parish for sponsoring this family event! We also want to thank JTM and Wassler's for their donations of food. And a huge thanks to our Knights of Columbus who grilled over 1000 hot dogs, brats, metts and burgers!

FAITH:

Girls are encouraged to grow in their faith and relationship with God through the AHG Faith Award Program, prayer, fellowship, and service, which are woven throughout each aspect of the AHG Program.

Outcome: A Christ-follower who submits to Christ and seeks God's will for her life.



LEADERSHIP:

The AHG Program is rich in leadership opportunities for girls of all ages. Girls discover their passions, acquire project management skills, hold leadership positions, and participate in leadership training.

Outcome: A servant leader who follows Jesus' model of leadership by putting others first.



SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL:
