AUG'S BLOG

Visitation Families,

Well, yesterday was certainly a new adventure for me as a principal! Kudos to our staff who did a great job dismissing yesterday, especially Mrs. Cook who took the lead. Every school in Ohio must submit a safety plan to the state -it's literally 100 pages long. It requires a procedure for every catastrophe from fire, to flooding, to intruders to even chemical leaks. Yesterday, we used all of our resources to make our decision to close school today. We contacted the Hamilton County administrator for school safety, the Three Rivers director of transportation, supervisors from the Catholic Schools

Office, watched the news, read articles on styrene, etc. This was not a decision we took lightly. Protecting your children is of the utmost importance to us and we will continue to work with those people moving forward. Ultimately, we realized many families were sheltering in place and would most probably not be able to attend school today. About 45% of our families live in the Three Rivers School District.

This is Part 2 of the Church Bulletin series called "Word and Worship" written by seminarian Jacob Schmiesing. The following explains the introduction: Immediately following the Sign of the Cross the priest greets the people with a few possible formulas. These formulas are quotations from the greetings and farewells from several of St. Paul's letters. The most common option, repeated throughout the mass, is "The Lord be with you." with the people's universal response "And with your spirit." This dialogue comes from the farewells of St. Paul's letters. In casual conversation, we are usually just happy to just wish that a part of a friend's day is satisfactory with "a good morning" or a "good afternoon". Such superb Scriptural salutations set the tone for the Mass by supplicating God for his gifts of grace, love, communion, peace, and most significantly, the Holy Spirit. And the Mass has scarcely started!

Students are off on Friday, Sept. 27th. The Visitation staff will be meeting with the staff of St. Jude to review Run, High, Fight Training, Theology of the Body Training and then collaborating with one another on specific subject matter.

Please make sure you put your family name on all uniform attire. Students take off jumpers, skirts, quarter zips etc for Physical Education classes during the day. In addition, please write your names on water bottles and lunch boxes which often get left behind. Be sure to have your students check the Lost and Found. We announce items found each day and then after a day or two send them to the Lost and Found near the auditorium.

Attendance: It is mandatory to provide a reason for your child's absence or tardiness. When you leave a message that states your child is "not coming in" or "absent" this equates to an unexcused absence. A reason for the absence MUST be given. As a reminder, 3 tardies with no doctor/dentist note equates to an unexcused absence. Teachers are NOT responsible for providing homework ahead of time for any recreational activities.
