School: Media Center (Library), just inside the North entrance on the left.


Auditorium, auditorium hallway by the trophy case.

FROM NURSE KNAPKE

Pinkeye: As many of you know (and may have experienced this school year), pink eye cases are on the rise. Pink eye (conjunctivitis) is incredibly contagious and easily spread within a family or even a classroom. Here are some signs of pink eye to look for:

- Burning, itching or eye pain
- Redness of the eye (especially the conjunctiva or white part of the eye)
- Tearing/watery eye
- Swollen eyelids
- Sensitivity to light
- Thick green or yellow drainage that makes the eyelashes stick together

If your child shows any of these symptoms, please contact your child's doctor. Pink eye can be caused by viruses, allergies, or bacteria. Students with bacterial pink eye **must** stay home until they have been on antibiotics for at least 24 hours.

Pink eye is spread by direct contact with the eye drainage from someone with an infection or from touching items contaminated with this drainage, such as toys, clothing, pens or pencils, make-up, or other articles. Symptoms may start within 1 to 3 days after contact with the infected drainage.

Ways you can help prevent Pink Eye:

- Wash hands often, especially before touching eyes or nose and before eating.
- Don't share items (like sunglasses, washcloths, make up, etc)
- Remind your children to keep their fingers out of their eyes and nose
- Frequent hand washing or use of hand sanitizer

COVID: Our Lady of the Visitation School will continue to follow all Covid-19 guidelines set forth by Hamilton County Public Health Department. Please see the information below or use the link. Call if you have questions or concerns.

If you have tested positive for Covid-19, stay home, isolate yourself for 5 days. After 5 days, wear a mask if your symptoms are improving and you are fever free without fever reducing medicine.

If you are a close contact of someone who has tested positive for covid (someone in your household), wear a mask for 10 days from the date of exposure and test yourself for Covid-19 on day 6.

Here is a brief overview of the most recent guidelines per Hamilton County Public Health:

After testing positive for Covid-19:

If you test positive for COVID-19, stay home for at least 5 days and isolate yourself from others in your home. Day 1 is the first day of symptom onset **OR** the day you tested positive whichever came first.

- If you had no symptoms-You may end isolation after day 5.
- If you had symptoms and your symptoms are improving:
 - You may end isolation after day 5 **IF** you are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication).
 - Wear your mask through day 10.
- If you had symptoms and your symptoms are **not** improving:
 - Continue to isolate until:
 1. You are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication).
 2. Your symptoms are improving.
 3. Call your healthcare provider.

After Being Exposed to COVID-19

Day 1 is the first day of exposure with the positive person.

- Wear a mask as soon as you find out you were exposed.
- Continue to wear a mask for 10 full days

- Get tested on Day 6
- If you test negative continue taking precautions through day 10
- Wear a high-quality mask when around others at home and indoors in public
- You may stop wearing the mask after day 11 if you have tested negative or you have no symptoms.

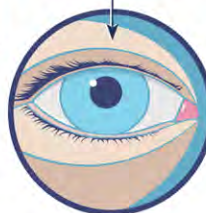

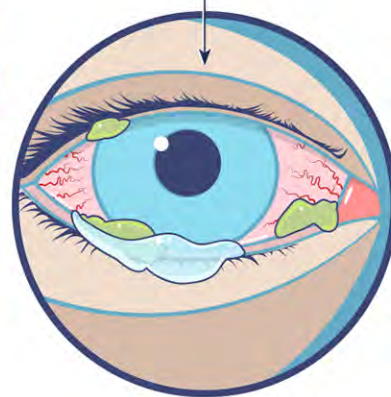

Newborns with symptoms of pink eye should see a doctor right away.

A doctor can usually diagnose the cause of pink eye based on symptoms and patient history.



- 👁️ Wash your hands often with soap and water, and help young children do the same. Wash hands especially well after touching someone with pink eye or their personal items.
- 👁️ Avoid touching or rubbing your eyes. This can worsen the condition or spread it to your other eye.
- 👁️ Avoid sharing personal items, such as makeup, eye drops, towels, bedding, contact lenses and containers, and eyeglasses.
- 👁️ Do not use the same eye products for your infected and non-infected eyes.
- 👁️ Stop wearing contact lenses until your eye doctor says it's okay.
- 👁️ Clean, store, and replace your contact lenses as instructed by your eye doctor.

Catholic Education Foundation/Archdiocese of Cincinnati

The Catholic Education Foundation funded by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati offers tuition assistance grants. All K-8 grade grants funded by the CEF will be awarded based upon the assessed financial need of our families, performed by a third-party company which will examine a family's income and suggest a level of need. Application is made through FACTS. All schools have been linked to the account of the Archdiocese.

Your application will automatically be reviewed by the Archdiocese as long as your completed application is submitted by the deadline.

Deadline: February 3, 2023

Grant Amount: The grant amount is determined on the number of eligible applications received yearly. The maximum awarded for the 22/23 school year for Visitation was \$1,200 per student.

Annual Applications: These grants must be applied for annually, and will be awarded without distinguishing between families based upon religion.

OLV Financial Aid

Financial Aid is available to qualifying families for the **2023-2024** school year with documented history of monetary support and participation in the life of the parish. In order to receive Financial Aid a family **MUST** apply through FACTS. A family will not be considered or awarded aid if an application with FACTS has not been filed or is incomplete.

If a financial crisis occurs during the course of a school year, parents will have an opportunity to request financial assistance by contacting the Business Manager and completing the application process.

The parish cannot meet all the requests for financial aid, but attempts to assist as many families as possible with the resources available.

Reminder: Families applying for aid from OLV need to submit 2021 Tax Returns and W-2's

A financial aid award will not be made until this information is provided. There are no exceptions to this requirement. Families receiving financial assistance are required to be an active parishioner and volunteer at least 20 hours per year. Those not receiving financial assistance are requested to volunteer at least six hours per year.

Who is considered a participating parishioner? It is important to remind our school families that to be considered a **participating parishioner**, eligible to apply for and possibly receive financial aid and receive the parishioner rate for tuition, a parishioner must:

- participate in the faith life of the Parish by regular attendance at Mass
- participate in the community life of the Parish by volunteering time and talents in ministries and organizations as able
- financially support the Parish on a regular, ongoing basis in addition to tuition
