This is a part of the Church Bulletin series called "Word and Worship" written by seminarian Jacob Schmiesing. It describes different parts of the mass. KYRIE- The petition for Mercy is explicit in the three-fold Kyrie, or the "Lord, have Mercy". The request for God's mercy appears too many times in the Bible to count but one of the most famous is the opening of Psalm 51. This Psalm was written after King David recognized how seriously he had sinned. "Have mercy on me, oh God." One example from the Gospel is the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector, when the tax collector leaves justified after

begging "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." (Luke 18:13)

Tomorrow begins our fall break. I hope that every family sets aside time to be together and enjoy the beauty of the fall. Just as you schedule in time for social occasions, it is important to schedule family time. As many of us older parents will tell you, time flies by and soon you will be asking yourself why you didn't make more time for them. Their youth is a gift to you!

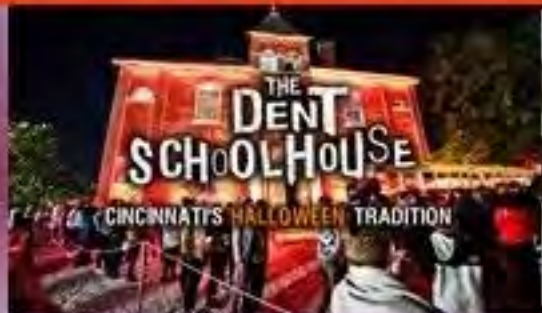

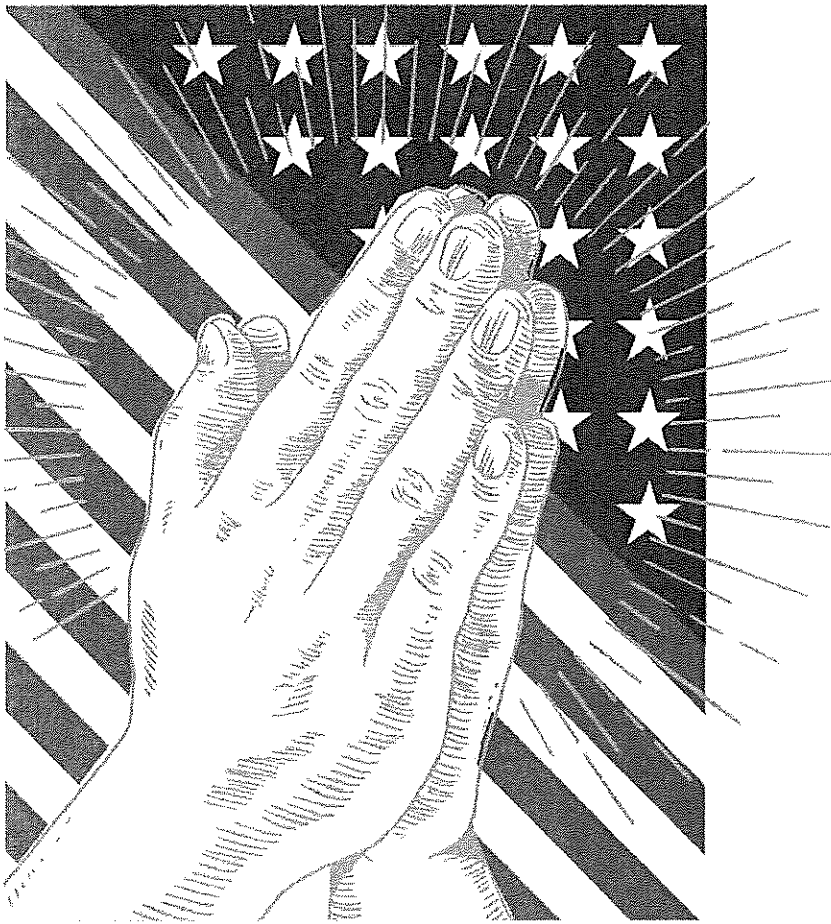
