COOK'S CURRICULUM CORNER

The Visitation student newspaper is making a comeback! Eighth grade students were informed of the opportunity to serve as members of the newspaper staff and help relaunch this important resource for sharing news about the school, clubs, parish, students and more! Mrs. Palicki will serve as a guide to facilitate publication of the newspaper and inform eighth graders of the positions that are available.



All eighth grade students were surveyed to gather information about their interest level. Results of the survey indicated an overwhelmingly positive interest in being part of this endeavor. Students were then invited to complete an application for the area they were most interested in applying for: editor, writer, creative team, advertising team, finance and publication team. On their application, students shared a variety of information such as skills that make them the best candidate for the job, ideas for the newspaper, their creative abilities, ability to work with technology, and all students had to write about what being a student at Visitation has meant to them. After very careful consideration of almost 40 applications received, 20 students were selected to fill the positions currently available. Students who were not selected for these particular

positions will still be considered to provide assistance with guest articles throughout the year. The newspaper staff will meet this week to discuss initial ideas such as name, layout, articles, sections, and publication timeline. Congratulations to the students below!

High School is Right around the Corner

How do my parents and I start the Catholic high school selection process?

- Attend open houses and high school information events. Explore each school's website.
- Investigate the spiritual, academic and extracurricular programs each school has to offer.
- Register to spend a day (in-person or virtually) at each high school your family is considering (often called a shadow day). Note: Eighth grade students are permitted at least 3 individual high school visits, during the school day, without penalty.
- Talk with parents, teachers, clergy, and high school students to gather input on the schools that best meet your needs spiritually, academically, and socially.
- Consider the cost of education at each school and examine which tuition assistance and scholarship programs might meet your family's needs.
- Inquire about each individual high school's admissions criteria.
- All eighth-grade students from Catholic and non-Catholic schools (public, charter schools, home schools, virtual schools, etc.) who are interested in applying to an Archdiocese of Cincinnati high school must take the High School Placement Test (HSPT) in the fall of eighth grade.
- Register for the HSPT. Registration can be found through the high schools' websites or at https://stsusers.com/stsusers/registration/static/cincinnati.php
- Students should maintain good grades, conduct, and attendance. They should also continue to be involved in school and community events.
- Students currently receiving State of Ohio Scholarship Programs (EdChoice, Jon Peterson, or Autism Scholarship) should verify that the high schools they are considering participate in the program.
- Begin to narrow the list of high school choices.

What should I know about the High School Placement Test registration?

- All applicants for Catholic high schools must take the High School Placement Test (HSPT) in the fall of their eighth-grade year.
- For applicants of the Class of 2027, the HSPT is held at all Catholic high schools on Saturday, November 19, 2022.

- All students may register to take the test at any of the Catholic high school locations for which they are eligible to enroll. Their test scores will be sent to the 3 high schools chosen during registration.
- The cost for the test is \$30 (processing fees may apply).
- Register for the HSPT. Registration can be found through the high schools' websites or at https://stsusers.com/stsusers/registration/static/cincinnati.php

How do I apply to a Catholic high school?

• Visit each individual school's website for their admissions process and application information. Deadlines vary for each school.

What if I attend a non-Catholic grade school?

- All students must register to take the HSPT at any of the Catholic high school locations for which they are eligible to enroll.
- Each high school to which you are applying will ask a parent/guardian to complete and sign a Records Release Form. This form grants permission for the student's current school to share records with the high school. Each high school's requirements for records may vary.

What criteria do schools look at when assessing an application?

- Catholic high schools will look at your 6th, 7th and 8th grade academic records.
- They will evaluate your standardized test scores and HSPT results.
- They may review your conduct, effort, and recommendations from your current school.
- Each high school is different. To learn more about each school's specific criteria, contact the high school directly.

Is financial assistance available?

- Yes. Contact each high school you are interested in for details on how and when to apply for scholarships and financial aid. Some deadlines end as early as November.
- Most high schools use FACTS Grant and Aid Assessment, a third party agent, to evaluate financial
 aid applications from applying families. Refer to page 5 to see total percent of students receiving
 financial aid and/or scholarships at individual schools.

How will I know if I am accepted?

• Admissions decisions from the high schools will be mailed/emailed on January 11, 2023.

How do I register after I am accepted?

- You will be notified of registration procedures by the individual high school.
- Per the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, registration for the Class of 2027 opens on January 25, 2023.
- A tuition deposit or registration fee may be required to reserve your place in the Class of 2027. Each admitting school will communicate that information to parents of eighth graders.

What should I do if I miss any of these deadlines?

• Families should contact the individual high school to request information about admission.
