HOT LUNCH / SEPTEMBER CREDIT CARD TRANSACTIONS – by Leslee House, Business

Manager: The electronic Hot Lunch program was put in place to make life easier for our school parents and our cafeteria personnel. Sorry to say, that the program presented challenges right out of the gate. Each and every parent who used a credit card probably encountered a snafu of some sort when trying to submit an order. It has been brought to my attention that when our credit card processing account was originally set up, by the merchant processor, it was done so incorrectly. (This was not an error by Hot Lunch.) As such, Hot Lunch credit card transactions submitted between September 1 - September 21, 2022 did not “settle”. Meaning customer credit cards were not charged and Our Lady of the Visitation did not receive payment for those Hot Lunch transactions. (This situation does not include or involve E-check payments.) Hot Lunch purchases made with a credit card, after September 21, 2022, have processed correctly.

Please be advised that the merchant processor will be resubmitting the credit card transactions that did not settle during the time period September 1 – September 21, 2022. If you see one or more transactions, come through, keep in mind that you may have had more than one Hot Lunch transaction during the September 1 – September 21, 2022, time period.

I apologize for this inconvenience. If upon review of your credit card statements, you feel that this amount is being charged in error or could be a duplicate charge please contact me (513) 922-2056 or via email Lhouse@olvisitation.org.

Catholic Education Foundation/Archdiocese of Cincinnati

The Catholic Education Foundation funded by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati offers tuition assistance grants. All K-8 grade grants funded by the CEF will be awarded based upon the assessed financial need of our families, performed by a third-party company which will examine a family's income and suggest a level of need. Application is made through FACTS. All schools have been linked to the account of the Archdiocese.

Your application will automatically be reviewed by the Archdiocese as long as your completed application is submitted by the deadline. Deadline date to be announced soon.

Typically at the end of Catholic Schools Week.

Grant Amount: The grant amount is determined on the number of eligible applications received yearly. The maximum awarded for the 22/23 school year for Visitation was \$1,200 per student.

Annual Applications: These grants must be applied for annually, and will be awarded without distinguishing between families based upon religion.

OLV Financial Aid

Financial Aid is available to qualifying families for the **2023-2024** school year with documented history of monetary support and participation in the life of the parish. In order to receive Financial Aid a family **MUST** apply through FACTS. A family will not be considered or awarded aid if an application with FACTS has not been filed or is incomplete.

If a financial crisis occurs during the course of a school year, parents will have an opportunity to request financial assistance by contacting the Business Manager and completing the application process.

The parish cannot meet all the requests for financial aid, but attempts to assist as many families as possible with the resources available.

**Reminder: Families applying for aid from OLV need to submit
2021 Tax Returns and W-2's**

A financial aid award will not be made until this information is provided. There are no exceptions to this requirement.

Families receiving financial assistance are required to be an active parishioner and volunteer at least 20 hours per year. Those not receiving financial assistance are requested to volunteer at least six hours per year.

Who is considered a participating parishioner? It is important to remind our school families that to be considered a ***participating parishioner***, eligible to apply for and possibly receive financial aid and receive the parishioner rate for tuition, a parishioner must:

- participate in the faith life of the Parish by regular attendance at Mass
- participate in the community life of the Parish by volunteering time and talents in ministries and organizations as able
- financially support the Parish on a regular, ongoing basis in addition to tuition

Catholic School Supporters May Be Eligible for an Ohio Tax Credit!



The State of Ohio has passed a bill that allows a tax credit for qualified donations to a certified Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO). Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, non-refundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750 per donor (up to \$1,500 if married and filing jointly).

See section 5747.73 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO).

In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, the CEF-SGO will provide scholarships (based on financial need) to students in grades K-12 in the Catholic schools of our Archdiocese.

Your donation can be designated to benefit a specific school(s).

Gifts that are not designated to a particular school will be available to families with the greatest need across our Archdiocese.

Consult with your tax advisor to determine:

(1) your eligibility for the state tax credit, (2) its value to you, and (3) the details of your gift.

PLEASE NOTE: According to a representative from the Ohio Department of Taxation, if you file a married joint return, each taxpayer would need to make their own \$750 contribution to claim the maximum of \$1,500. Separate acknowledgement letters will be provided for documentation of your gifts.

Justin & Rita Weber Family Scholarship

The Justin & Rita Weber Family Scholarship was created in memory of the lives of Justin and Rita Weber, founding members of Our Lady of the Visitation Parish and one of the first couples to be married by Father Leonard Vonderbrink, the Parish's first Pastor. Justin and Rita raised ten children, all of whom attended Our Lady of the Visitation School. After grade school the children all attended Catholic high schools. Justin and Rita volunteered many hours of their time to numerous parish and school organizations while raising their family. They raised their family with Christian values and made the necessary sacrifices to assure their children had the benefit of a Catholic education. It is in recognition of these sacrifices that the family of Justin & Rita has established a scholarship to financially assist a Visitation student who desires to continue his or her Catholic education at a local parochial high school.

Application

Award Will Be Given: To one 8th grade student of Our Lady of Visitation School enrolling at a parochial high school in the Cincinnati area.

Deadline: Applications must be submitted by January 20th, 2023.

Criteria: The applicant must graduate from Our Lady of Visitation in spring of 2023 and attend a parochial high school in the Cincinnati area in the fall of 2023. He or she will need to have a grade average for the 7th and 8th grade years of C+ or better. There will be one \$1500 scholarship awarded and credited to the winner's tuition for the 9th grade and sent directly to his/her high school. Completed applications shall be submitted to the OLV school office. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered. As part of the application, applicants shall create and submit a 2 to 3 paragraph essay. The topic of the essay is "**Describe how your practice of the Catholic Faith has been strengthened and influenced by your family**". Applicants may share an experience, tradition, situation or anything that has involved both their family and their faith. It is important that the essay be neat, legible and checked for both grammar and spelling. If the applicant would want to type or print the essay on a separate sheet of paper, that is acceptable. Please place your completed application (unstapled and your name only on the first page) in an envelope clearly marked with "Justin and Rita Weber Family Scholarship Application" and submit it to the school office by January 20th, 2023.

Our Lady of the Visitation Auditorium

- 1) The car cannot weigh more than 5oz.
- 2) Scouts can weigh their car up to 3 times before doing the official weigh in, allowing for adjustments if needed.
- 3) Nothing should be added to the car that makes it wider than it already is with the wheels on. If the car ends up being any wider, it cannot race. It must fit comfortably in its lane. The track has a minimum clearance required, so adding items to the bottom may cause issues.
- 4) The entire front/tip of the car must be at the starting line. It cannot exceed the line by design.
- 5) Anything that falls off the car once entered, during or after the race will not be re-adhered for the next race(s).
